

**PROTOCOL BETWEEN ROUMANIA AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA
CONCERNING THE PROLONGATION OF THE CONVENTION OF
DEFENSIVE ALLIANCE CONCLUDED ON APRIL 23, 1921.
SIGNED AT BUCHAREST, JUNE 13, 1926**

Whereas the effects of the Convention of defensive Alliance of April 23, 1921, prolonged for three years by the Protocol signed at Prague on May 7, 1923, have been found to be beneficial to the cause of peace and its maintenance therefore being considered necessary, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries, having been invested with full powers, found in good and due form, by HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF ROUMANIA and by THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC, respectively, have agreed to the following provisions:

The Convention of defensive Alliance of April 23, 1921, prolonged for three years by the Protocol signed at Prague on May 7, 1923, shall remain in force for a further period of three years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Protocol. Upon the expiration of this period, the Convention shall again be subject to denunciation according to the final provisions of Article 5.

The Military Convention concluded in accordance with Article 2 of the foregoing Convention shall be prolonged for the same period.

The present Protocol shall be communicated to the League of Nations (in virtue of the Covenant of the League of Nations).

The present Protocol shall be ratified and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at Bled on June 17, 1926.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Protocol and have thereto affixed their seals.

Done in duplicate at Bucharest on the thirteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty six.
