

## **PROTOCOL CONSTITUTING A DECLARATION WITH REGARD TO THE FINAL DELIMITATION OF THE FRONTIER BETWEEN ESTONIA AND LATVIA. RIGA, MARCH 31, 1927**

The Government of the Estonian Republic and the Government of the Latvian Republic, founding their conclusions upon:

1. The Convention between Estonia and Latvia, concluded at Walk on March 22 1920, and the decisions rendered on July 1 and 3, 1920, by Colonel Tallents who acted as arbiter under the aforesaid Convention;
2. The Convention concluded on October 19, 1920, between Estonia and Latvia regarding the fixing of the frontier between the above-mentioned Republics and its delimitation on the ground and also regarding the rights of the citizens of either State in the territory of the other State and the status of immovable property intersected by the frontier lines;
3. The Supplementary Convention on Frontier Questions, dated November 1, 1923, and the Protocol of the same date;
4. The Protocol of February 23, 1927, supplementing the Conventions of October 19, 1920, and November 1, 1923;

And having noted that the Mixed Estonian-Latvian Frontier Commission has carried out the work entrusted to it regarding the delimitation on the ground of the frontier between Estonia and Latvia and has signed on March 30, 1927, the Survey Record containing a detailed description of the ground on the frontier and the official plans,

DECLARE:

That the frontier between Estonia and Latvia is held to be definitively fixed as from April 1, 1927.

The two Governments have agreed to communicate the text of the present Protocol to the Legislative Chambers of the respective States.
