

**VERBAL NOTE BY WHICH THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT IN
PURSUANCE OF ARTICLE 8 OF THE PEACE TREATY WITH BULGARIA,
NOTIFIED THE BULGARIAN GOVERNMENT OF THOSE PRE-WAR
BILATERAL TREATIES BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES, WHICH
CZECHOSLOVAKIA DESIRES TO KEEP IN FORCE.
SOFIA, 5 MARCH 1948**

Acting on the instructions of its Ministry, the Legation of the Czechoslovak Republic in Sofia has the honour to request the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to communicate to the Bulgarian Government the following:

In accordance with the provisions of article 8 of the Peace Treaty with Bulgaria concluded in Paris on 10 February 1947, the Czechoslovak Government desires to keep in force the following bilateral treaties concluded between Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria before the war:

1. Convention between Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria concerning reciprocal judicial protection and assistance in matters of civil and commercial law, concluded at Sofia on 15 May 1926;
2. Convention between Czechoslovakia and Bulgaria relating to extradition and judicial assistance in criminal matters, concluded at Sofia on 15 May 1926;
3. Convention between the Czechoslovak Republic and the Kingdom of Bulgaria concerning free medical assistance to the poor, concluded at Sofia on 6 June 1925.
