

RESOLUTION NO. 41/ 1991./ VII.1./ OF THE HUNGARIAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ON THE RATIFICATION OF THE PROTOCOL ON THE ANNULATION OF THE TREATY ON FRIENDSHIP, CO-OPERATION AND MUTUAL ASSISTANCE SIGNED IN WARSAW ON 14 MAY 1955 AND OF THE PROTOCOL SIGNED IN WARSAW ON 26 APRIL 1985 ON THE EXTENSION OF THE VALIDITY OF THE LATTER

Following up on a motion of the Government, the Hungarian National Assembly

- ratifies the Protocol signed in Prague on 1 July 1991 the annulation of the Treaty on Friendship, Co-operation and Mutual Assistance signed in Warsaw on 14 May 1955 and of the Protocol signed in Warsaw on 26 April 1985 on the extension of the validity of the latter,
- requests the President of the Republic to issue the instrument of ratification.

REASONS

Representatives of the member states of the Warsaw Treaty signed on Protocol in Prague on 1 July 1991 on the annulation of the international treaty establishing the organization.

The Protocol has to be ratified and based on the subject of the Protocol, the right to do so falls upon the National Assembly. With its resolution, the National Assembly complies with the obligation contained in paragraph 1 of Article 3 of the Protocol and contributes significantly to the success of the process aiming at removing the division of the European continent.
