

RESOLUTION NO. 109/ 1996./ XII./ 17./ ON THE PROMOTION OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE SFOR-FORCES IN THE INTEREST OF STABILIZING THE SITUATION IN THE FORMER YUGOSLAVIA INCLUDING THE PARTICIPATION OF THE HUNGARIAN ENGINEERING CONTINGENT.

The Hungarian National Assembly

1. considering the obligations of the Republic of Hungary stemming from the United Nations Charter and paragraph / 1/ of / § 40/c. of the Constitutions, gives its preliminary consent for the units of the Stabilization Force /SFOR/ to be established upon a resolution taken by the United National Security Council ensuring the enhancement of the peaceful resolution of the crisis in the former Yugoslavia to transit through and be temporarily stationed on the territory of Hungary, including also the preparation of IFOR-units during the period of stationing, as well as the fulfillment of command and logistics tasks required for the activities of IFOR and furthermore, for its aircraft to use the airspace of the country and its designed airport in that framework.

The transit and stationing may proceed not longer than 31 December 1998.

2. authorizes the Government to accord all the exemptions practiced in inter national law to the units of IFOR during the time of transit through and temporary stationing in Hungary and to agree with the individual states participating in the IFOR-operation on the detailed conditions of their transit and temporary stationing and the respective financial aspects.

The authorization also involves the possibility for the Government to temporarily further apply the agreements concluded in the context of the transit through and temporary stationing in Hungary of the IFOR-troops as well as to review and, if necessary, to initiate their amendment.

3. gives its consent for the independent Hungarian engineering sub-unit of limited strength /not more than 500 troops/ assigned in the framework of the Forces Implementing the Peaceful Resolution of the Crisis of the Former Yugoslavia /IFOR/ and equipped with the necessary technical means, individual (self-defensive) weapons and equipment pursue their activities in the framework of the SFOR-forces that are to be established upon a resolution taken by the United Nations Security Council until not later than 1 September 1998.

4. The Hungarian National Assembly will adopt a separate resolution on the eventual extension of the duration of the assignment.

5. The present Resolution enters into force on the day of its promulgation.
