VISEGRÁD GROUP. PRESS COMMUNIQUE (NOVEMBER 13TH, 2000)

On November 13th expert consultations of foreign ministries of Poland, the Czech Republic, the Slovak Republic, Hungary and Slovenia were held in Warsaw to assess the situation in South-Eastern Europe and to discuss matters of regional co-operation. There was agreement that the inclusion of Yugoslavia into International organizations and mechanisms of co-operation would help to stabilize the situation in the Balkans and that the democratic changes in this country would open new opportunities for regional co-operation.

The participants of consultations confirmed the interest of their countries in further exchanges of information and views about important issues of European policy, including situation in the Balkans. Along with the decisions of heads of government of four countries the Visegrád Group remains a structure open to co-operation with interested countries like Slovenia.
